Recent history leading up to the re-establishment of the nation of Israel:

1897 Theodor Herzl started the Zionist Movement (Central aim of movement to re-establishment of a Jewish national homeland in Palestine by facilitating Jewish return from diaspora, as well as the re-establishment of a Jewish state.)

1917 Balfour Declaration (Confirmation of support from the British government for the establishment in Palestine of a "national home" for the Jewish people.)

1939 Jewish 2 state solution (Proposed by Peel Commission)

1947 United Nations Partition Plan for a Jewish and Arab state

1948 May 14th Israeli Declaration of Independence (Formal Declaration of the Establishment of the State of Israel was proclaimed by David Ben-Gurion, the Executive Head of the World Zionist Organization & soon to be 1st Prime Minster of Israel)

1948 May 15th Israel War of Independence (The first day of Israeli Independence when 5 Arab armies invaded Israel and the first Arab-Israeli war began - Israel won.)

1967 June 5th The Six Day War (Egypt, Syria, and Jordan against Israel with Israel gaining the
